A Closer Look: Palm Sunday

- 1. Jesus told the disciples to go to the village. There they would find a colt and donkey for Him to use. What did He tell the disciples to do? (He told them to untie them and bring them to Him.)
- 2. What were the disciples to say to the owner? (The Lord needs them.)
- 3. Why did Jesus ride into Jerusalem on a donkey? (He knew the prophesy of the Old Testament.) Why was this important? (He was now telling everyone he was the King that was promised by Zechariah.)
- 4. How big is His kingdom? (He would rule from sea to sea, and from the river to the ends of the earth.)
- 5. What is His role as King? (He would speak peace to the nations) How would He rule? (Humble, righteous and having salvation.)
- 6. What did the people do to honor Jesus when He rode into Jerusalem? (*They spread their cloaks and palm branches onto the road in front of Him.*)
- 7. What did the people shout? (Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!)
- 8. In humility, Jesus was telling the people He was the King of the Nations. Jesus also knew He was coming to Jerusalem to be crucified. How can we as Christians be like Jesus? (We can seek God's will for our lives. We can serve others humbly. We will want to willing serve out of love for God.)
- 9. What burden did Jesus bear for us? (He carried the weight of our sin when He died on the cross for us.)
- 10. What can we do to honor King Jesus? (Praise Him with our songs, our prayers, and our life. Tell others of His great love for them.)

The Triumphal Entry

Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, 2 saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to Me. 3 If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once."

4 This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying, 5 "Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Behold, your King is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

6 The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. 7 They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and He sat on them.

8 Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. 9 And the crowds that went before Him and that followed Him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

10 And when He entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" 11 And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee."
