Mateo 26:17-19, 26-30 - La Cena del Señor

17 El primer día de la fiesta de los Panes sin levadura, se acercaron los discípulos a Jesús, diciéndole:--¿Dónde quieres que preparemos para que comas la Pascua?

18 Él dijo:--Id a la ciudad, a cierto hombre, y decidle: "El Maestro dice: «Mi tiempo está cerca; en tu casa celebraré la Pascua con mis discípulos»" 19 Los discípulos hicieron como Jesús les mandó y prepararon la Pascua.

26 Mientras comían, tomó Jesús el pan, lo bendijo, lo partió y dio a sus discípulos, diciendo:--Tomad, comed; esto es mi cuerpo. 27 Y tomando la copa, y habiendo dado gracias, les dio, diciendo:--Bebed de ella todos, 28 porque esto es mi sangre del nuevo pacto que por muchos es derramada para perdón de los pecados. 29 Os digo que desde ahora no beberé más de este fruto de la vid hasta aquel día en que lo beba nuevo con vosotros en el reino de mi Padre.

30 Después de haber cantado el himno, salieron al Monte de los Olivos.

Matthew 26:17-19, 26-30 - The Lord's Supper

Now on the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Where will You have us prepare for You to eat the Passover?" 18 He said, "Go into the city to a certain man and say to him, 'The Teacher says, My time is at hand. I will keep the Passover at your house with My disciples." 19 And the disciples did as Jesus had directed them, and they prepared the Passover.

26 Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." 27 And He took a cup, and when He had given thanks He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you, 28 for this is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. 29 I tell you I will not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom."

30 And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

A Closer Look: The Lord's Supper

At the time of the first Passover, God told His people to put the blood of a lamb on their door posts to protect them from death. They were told to celebrate this Passover every year so they would remember God's love for them. Jesus is the Perfect Lamb of God. He protects us from eternal death through His death on the cross. Jesus tells us to remember what He has done for us each time we celebrate the Lord's Supper.

- 1. What is the difference between dying and eternal death? (We all die. Our life ends. Eternal death means we will be apart from God forever in hell.) How does God protect you from eternal death and take you to heaven? (You will have eternal life, when you believe that Jesus died for your sins and arose from the dead.)
- 2. Just before He died, Jesus gave the Lord's Supper. What other names have you heard for the Lord's Supper? (*The Lord's Supper, Communion, The Eucharist, The Last Supper*)
- 3. After giving thanks, Jesus gave the disciples bread to eat. What words did He say? (*"Take eat, this is My Body."*) When He gave them wine to drink, what words did He say? (*"Take drink, this is My blood."*)
- 4. When you take the Lord's Supper, your sins are forgiven. How do you know this is true? (*Matthew 26:28 says "This is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."*)
- 5. What does it mean to be forgiven by God? (When we confess our sins, God shows mercy and does not remember our sins.) What does it mean to forgive others? (We show compassion to those that have wronged us.) Is this easy for us? (No!)
- 6. Jesus said, "Do this in remembrance of Me." What does this mean? (He wants us to remember that He died for our sins and that He has a home waiting for us in heaven.)
- **7. Why should we go to communion?** (*Our sins are forgiven. It is a way for us to always remember that heaven is waiting for those that love God.*)
